with the palsy on the 17th of March at night in
1835 and being weak on one side but being in
perfect health of body and mind and memory
and calling to mind the mortality of my body
I recommend my soul to God who gave it and
and my body to the dust to be buried in a
decent manner at the discretion of my relations
It also hath pleased God to bless me with sever-
al species of property I have that well to distribute
it at my death among my relations

Section 1st I Bequeath unto my Wife Phoebe ten
dollars three years after my death

Section 2nd I Bequeath unto my daughter
Agnes Day three years after my death

Section 3rd I Bequeath unto Son Charles
McDonald ten dollars three years after my
death with all my tools

Section 4th I Bequeath unto my son Jas McLean
McDonald the one hundred and twenty five
dollars that I had to pay Reid as security
for him

Section 5th I Bequeath unto my son Melton
McDonald ten dollars 3 years after my death

Section 6th I Bequeath unto my son Robert
McDonald ten dollars three years after my death

Section 7th I Bequeath unto my daughter Lucinda
Lee Luke now widow ten dollars five years after
my death if she marries Plisha May and I she does
not then and in that case my will is for her to

have fifty dollars in three years after my death

Section 8th of Bequath unto my daughter Mary
Strensons hereby being after their mother's death
my three Negroes by our husbands John Strenson
paying to my heirs the six great sums of money as
it is come due or soon after (1813) Rose and her
two children Sara and David Stenon with their
increase the three Negroes must not be sold or
disposed of to no other person persons whatsoever.

Section 9th There is also one hundred and seven
ty two dollars in an bank notes due to John
Strenson in the true account that he in fact gave
to the said wife before he was within the state of Virginia
in to no person but the said Strenson all my
debts and all my other and with it pay all my just
debts and the rest of any right to be divided among
my heirs equally

Now being satisfied that all my debts among
my heirs according to my will except such as will
pay debts I do hereby make and ordain my extreme
friend Sebastian M. Black and my son-in-law
John Strenson Executors of this my last will
and testament, and I do hereby dissolve revoke
and disannul all and every other former will and
testament or codicil or any and executor by me
heretofore made ratifying in confirming this to be
my last will and testament By which I do hereby
ordain James Mc Donald the testator here to this my
will written on one sheet of paper but my name
and date was the tenth day of January in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
thirty nine
