Newton County June 30th 1849

In the name of God Amen:

I John Green being in a low state of health and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life; and being of sound and disposing mind do hereby make this my last will and testament that is to say, I will and desire that my beloved Wife Nancy G. Green do remain on and have the benefits of the premises, or plantation, on which I now reside, during her natural life, or widowhood. It is further my desire that out of the proceeds of my estate, my beloved children shall enjoy the advantages of a good english education.

It is my will and desire, that my beloved Wife have the use and benefit of all the property now in my possession as above, during her natural life, or widowhood.

I do hereby appoint and nominate my beloved brother Abraham Green as my Executor to carry out the intention of this my last will and testament.

It is my desire that the want of due form shall not invalidate, or set aside the true meaning or intent of this my last will and testament.

Moreover I will that at the death or marriage of my beloved Wife there be an equal division, among my beloved children, of all my estate.
