I John D Duke having lived more than the usual time allotted to man, of full old age, but even so in mind, and being desirous to dispose of the property which God has blessed me, make this my last will and testament.

Item 1st I give my debt to God who gave it to my body to the world from whence it came trusting that God will receive it up again at the resurrection of the just.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto my grandchildren John and Catherine Nottingham Lewis Smith Fletcher and Thomas McRae the lot of land lying in Macon County to be sold and the proceeds to be equally divided between them in part of all claims against my estate.

Item 3rd I will and direct that my negroes and all the property not otherwise disposed of be sold and over the proceeds after paying my just debts, to be distributed as hereafter provided.

Item 4th I give and bequeath unto Thos. M. Duke & Edwin Shephard for the use of my Daughter Lucy Hartwell & to the heirs of her body after her in equal distribution share arising from the sale of my property as above directed, to be used or invested by said trustees as they may seem most beneficial to the parties in interest.

Item 5th I give and bequeath unto my sons Joseph Duke, Thos. M. Duke, Payton Duke, & my Daughters Deborah Allen, and Emily Shephard each an equal distribution share arising from the sale of my property

as above directed, provided however that the sum of Six hundred dollars be first deducted from the share of Thos. M. Duke being the value of the land that I have heretofore given him.

Item 6th Regarding all former wills I appoint Thos. M. Duke & Edwin Shephard Executors to to this my last Will and Testament.
