to my Creator. I give it to as touching my Will
in & offhand I Will them distributed as hereafter
mentioned

Item 1st I give to my beloved Wife, Standes, & my
four sons Barwell Moss, John Moss, Thomas Moss
& William Moss, their half Lot of Land whereon
I now live four negroes. Namely Charles Saml
Vitt & Maria Witt all my estate of Wares
Cattle & other plantation tools & other like
furniture.

Item 2 I give to my son W. guardian & Father found
that he is capable of managing the same. Also I give
body & furniture.

Item 3 I give to my son as guardian & Father standes
Moss two negroes. Vicks & Sarah also one bed
& furniture.

& Vicks. All my other property not above mentioned to
be given to William Moss, James Moss & Andy
Moss equally as to son Witt. Who has said
& my daughter Jimmy Barwell I think I
have given her before & equal portion. But
Will leave them in their representation as
dollar each.

I nominate & appoint William White, Christopher J. Carter
& William Moss my lawful Executors to this my
last Will & testament. In testimony whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & seal this 6th October 1826.

Twenty three on March the 1st John Hamilton of the
State of Georgia and Justice of the Peace being in my proper
mind and perfect sense and memory do make this my
last Will and testament At the time being then actually re-
siding all former wills made by me standing this to
be my last Will and testament
I do leave unto my son Cadmus Hamilton two
Magers land by the name of Pine and Oak also
also the land on a rising in the south west side of the
Spring branch running through the Oak lots or tract of
land numbered two hundred & seven in the western
district of Henry County now Newton County also
the Spring Oak tract of an acre of land round
the Spring.
Also I do leave my son George H. Hamilton One Mager
land by the name of Orchard also a Mager land by the
name of Washington also I do leave the blackman of
the lot mentioned last hundred and seven in the above
mentioned district and County With the exception of
the sum of the same just my wife Rebecca Hamilton
and life then he is to have possession of said land
also I do give my son George H. Hamilton the lot and
land on the place of his district One hundred and two
in the eastern district of Henry County
now Newton County last said George is to have
