Newton County } In the name of God - Amen. I John Saucy
 of said State and County being of an advanced
 age and knowing that I must shortly depart from this
 world deem it right and proper both as it respects myself
 and my family, that I should make a disposition of the
 property with which a kind Providence has blessed me.
 I therefore make this my last Will and Testament -
 hereby revoking and annulling all others heretofore made
 by me.

Item First I desire and direct that my body be
 buried in a decent and Christian like manner, suitable
 to my circumstances and situation.

Item Second I desire and direct that all my
 just debts be paid without delay by my Executors
 hereinafter named and appointed.

Item Third - I give and devise to my beloved Wife
 Mary all my estate both real and personal, combe-
 cing lands negroes horses stock household furniture
 and utensils of every description, money right and credit,
 and whatever other thing I may possess to have and
 to hold during her widowhood, and to exercise full
 control over, in the sale, management and disposition
 thereof, as she may think proper; and to give off to
 her children whatever portions she may see proper
 either before or at her death; Provided that if in my
 wife Mary shoulda intemary after my death at any time
 then and in that event she is no longer entitled to the
 above bequest, but my entire estate both real and
 personal shall then be equally divided among my said
 Wife and all my children; she receiving a child's part
 And in the event of such equal division ever being
 made then whatever may have been advanced to any
 of my children with

or by my said wife after my death shall be taken
into the account and every one shall accordingly

Item fourth I desire and direct that my said
Wife Mary during her widowhood may give off
whenever of my estate she may see proper at any
time before or at her death to my children; to each
one in whatever proportion she may see and so
whenever time she may see proper: I desire that
whatever she may give to my daughter Sarah
wife of Barry Camp, shall be made over to her
and her children not subject to the debts or
control of her husband.

Item fifth I constitute and appoint my beloved
wife Mary my executrix and my sons John &

Francis and Thomas executors of this my last will
and Testament - this the 6th day of August and
year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty
