I Joel Jones of the County of Newton and State of Georgia in Good health and of a sound disposing mind yet bearing in mind the Mortality of my body I do hereby Ordain this my last will and Testament,

Item the first— I will that my body be decently buried and that all my debts be paid.

Item the second— I will that my beloved wife Nancy hold in her possession during her natural life, all my estate both real and personal.

Item the third— I will that at or after the death of my beloved wife the following distribution of my estate both real and personal be made.

Item the fourth— I will that my landed estate be equally divided between my two sons曹尔 and James.

Item the fifth— I will that my four daughters namely Rebekah Evans Nancy Ann Cynthia Rufel & Susannah Newton each have Sixty five Dollars.

Item the sixth— I will that my executors at the death of my beloved wife take into their possession my two negro (namely Cindy and Coud) and hold them in their possession till John becomes twenty one Years of age (if he should not be that at the death of one of my wife) at which time if there should be no law in the State of Georgia at that time by which they can be emancipated, I will that my executors take the said two negro (namely Cindy and Coud) to some State in the Union where they can obtain their emancipation and to pursue the course prescribed by the law of that State to which they may go made and provided for the emancipation of people of colour that they may be recognized in that State as free people of colour.

Item the seventh— I will that my son James also have a horse worth sixty Dollars, a saddle and bridle.

Item the eighth— I will that all the balance of my estate not disposed above be equally divided amongst my children viz Timothy Jones, Elizabeth Evans, Folly Evans, Rebekah Evans, Nancy Ann, Cynthia Rufel, Susannah Newton, William Jones, Joel Jones, and James Jones.

Item the ninth— I will that my two sons曹尔 and James

and Joel Jones, be executors to this my last will and
Testament. Signed with my hands and sealed with my
seal this nineteenth day of October in the Year of our Lord
