Item first I desire that all my just debts and burial expenses be paid promptly and speedily as possible after my death

Item second I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Nancy H. Jones my Negro boy Marcus; And it is my most earnest desire that my beloved Wife should as long as she may live keep the said boy Marcus under her immediate care and control; and that my said Wife may before her death, make such he shall conveyance of the said boy Marcus, by Will or otherwise to take effect after her death, as will best carry out her known desire and will to be my wishes in regard to the said boy Marcus; All this I most cheerfully commit to the sound discretion of my beloved Wife

Item third I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Nancy H. Jones All my property both real and personal of whatsoever kind or character of which I may die possessed

Item fourth I desire and request, that my beloved Wife shall, before her death, by will or otherwise out of the property which she may have, create a fund of like money and dollars, to be placed in the hands of some fit and proper person after

her death, as Trustee for the said boy Marcus the interest of which said sum may be by such Trustee applied to the use and benefit of the said boy Marcus as his necessities may require

Item Fifth I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved Wife Nancy H. Jones sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament with full power and authority to sell and convey any portion of my property in such manner as she may think best for her interest and happiness
