

In the name of God Amen I Joseph Peay of the County of Newton and State of Georgia, being afflicted in body but of sound mind & memory and calling to mind the mortality of the body & knowing that it is appointed for all men even to die, do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows viz. In the first place I commit my soul to God who gave it and my body to the dust, to be buried in a plain manner and as touching such worldly substance it herewith bed has been pleasure to slip me I dispose of it in the following manner, namely,

To my dearly beloved Wife Eliza Anna Peay I give the following property for her use and support during her natural life, and at her death to be disposed of as is herein after mentioned viz. Dudley, Bill, Ben, Sam, Solomon, Caroline, Betty and Lem. Sixty of the choice mules, the stock of cattle & hogs as many plantation tools as will be necessary to carry on her business, my carriage and Duggys, the wagon and two of the carts and oxen & also the stock of sheep. And it is further my will that she have as much of my land on which I live as she sees proper to cultivate and the use of the dwelling house and such other out houses contiguous as she may desire stand in need of, without rent, the use of all the house hold and kitchen furniture spinning machine & cotton gin during her natural life except such as are not otherwise disposed of.

To William H. Whistler the following negroes also Jerry and Malipoo.

To my son Potter B Peay I give the following negroes viz Susan Caesar and Nancy, and also one fifth of my library. One lot of books from 1834 to 1851

decently rashed of the slaves & their known  
by number his horses and eight sheep. Five head of  
Sheep.

To my wife Libbie son wife Mr. Perry the following  
negroes viz. Jack, Henry, Liza & Harriet, the lot of land  
lying in Newton County, joining the lands of Curtis &  
others, known as the Woodmire place containing about  
four hundred & ninety acres, two cows & calves, five  
head of Sheep, one box & furniture, & one fifth of my  
library.

To my son James Perry the following negroes viz  
Frank, Franklin, Eliza, Nellida & Emily, a lot of land  
in Stewarts County, number forty, in the eighth  
district - two cows & calves, one box and furniture, five  
head of Sheep & one fifth of my library.

To my Daughter Amanda Perry I give and bequeath  
the following negroes viz. Bill, Mark, Nine, Nine  
& the. One box and furniture two cows and calves, &  
five head of Sheep.

To my Daughter Sarah Perry I give the  
following negroes viz. Waddie, Nancy, Miller, Lawrence  
& Peter. One box and furniture two cows & calves  
& five head of Sheep.

To my Son Josiah Perry I will & the  
following negroes viz. Mrs. Libby, Martha, Caroline, Penny  
& Moses. And also one half in value of the lands on  
which I live, subject to the encumbrances of his mother's  
life estate, her cows and calves on box & furniture  
five head of Sheep and one fifth of my library.

To my Son Henry Bradford Perry the follow-  
ing negroes viz. Charles, Anna, Simon, Ben & Betty  
and also the other half in value of the lands on which  
I live subject to his mother's life estate two cows and  
calves, one box and furniture, five head of Sheep.

and one fifth of my library books

To my Daughter Mary, from Perry I give & the following  
negroes viz. Peggy, Martin, Aaron & Kitty and also four  
sheep and twelve and half hundreth of George Bois Ranch  
Stock, two cows and calves, one box and furniture, five head  
of Sheep.

To George Perry I give at & bequeath the following  
negroes viz. Maria, Mary, Rufus, Dick, Lem, four sheep  
& twelve & hundreth of George Bois Ranch Stock, two cows  
and calves, one box and furniture & five head of Sheep.

And in addition to the property given to my wife  
in the first clause of this my last will & testament. I  
give unto her all my money and all other evidences  
of debt belonging to me, the crop of cotton now in hand  
and also the ear fodder & all other forage on the plan-  
tation now because the crop of the present year now  
in progress of maturing, she paying the overseer one  
hundred and fifty dollars and other expenses  
incurred in making the crop - Resolving all former  
wills and testaments, I hereby constitute this my last  
will and testament and appoint my beloved wife my  
sole Executor.

of the property a good Providence has enabled me to possess  
so freely and the better publish and declare the following to  
be my last will and testament hereby revoking any &  
all other wills at any time made by me  
Item the first. It is my will & desire that my exec-  
utor pay my just debts if any be due.

Item the second. I give and bequeath to my beloved  
Wife Martha Rosebury during her natural life the  
tract of land upon which I now reside lying and being  
in the County of Newton containing two hundred acres &  
one half acres more or less, lying on McCall's creek adjoin-  
ing the lands of Livingston, Brown, Thompson and Miller  
and two negro Slaves (Nig) Westley a man about twenty  
years of age, and Nancy a woman about eighteen years  
of age, which said two negro slaves are hereby given  
to my wife forever, and to be disposed of by my said  
wife in her life ~~time~~ or at her death as she may  
then fit, which boy Westley is now known to Robert  
Woodruff.

Item the third. I give and bequeath to my wife  
Martha Rosebury期间 all my household & Kitchen  
furniture of my name & kind, farming tools, a horse to be  
selected by herself, one East Indian wagon, and such of my  
stock (cattle & Hogs) as my said wife may select, and  
a sufficiency of provisions to support her & her family for  
one year.

Item the fourth I do hereby give and bequeath to  
John A Williamson of Lexington in trust for my son  
Richard Rosebury the undivided half of the lot of land  
upon which I now reside, which lot is more particularly  
described in the second Item of this my will, the use
