It is also my will and wish, that at the death of my daughter Sarah Wighthead that the residue of the five hundred Dollars given to her for her support be so well divided among all my children except Spencer Shaw, & William Wighthead & Gilbert Wighthead. I do hereby ordain Joshua Wighthead and Wm J. Fisher my executors to this my last will and Testament having knowing all formally by me made, in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the this my last will and Testament this the 1st day of November 1830.

 her natural life, all the privilege of the land and
 promise to her on and raise support during her
 life time — also all the stock of horses, cattle, sheep, and
 hay & sheep, with plantation tools, house hold & kitchen
 furniture for her proper use and benefit during her life
 and at the death of the fornicate Annina Ellipt I give
 to my two loving sons Joseph Ellipt & Thomas all Ellipt
 all my land and promise to be equally divided in the
 following manner viz beginning on the corner line at the center
 of said line running thence to the old bonny line so as
 to give each one an equal number of acres Joseph all Ellipt
