God keeping and believing in the Resurrection of my
body by the Death and Mediation of Jesus Christ
and my body I bequeath to the care to be taken
of the Execution of my Executor herein after
mentioned and all my worldly Estate I give and
bequeath to my
son Joseph and devise to my son Robert B
Livingston his heirs and assigns more all that I do
own and I do bequeath to him and to hold to my
son Robert B Livingston also I do bequeath
to my Eldest son Robert B Livingstons
named Richard about sixteen years of age
and also I give to my son Joseph Livingston
the sum of sixty five Dollars and to my
daughter Elizabeth M Livingstons the sum
of forty five Dollars also I bequeath to Robert
B Livingston my Shot Gun

All remaining property of every description
standing with the plantation with the household
and kitchen furniture is to be and remain
in the power to be possessed of my beloved wife
Elizabeth Livingston in case of death or death
during her natural life all the remaining
property at that time of every description
to be equally divided between the undersigned
sons to wit in their heirs or assigns Shadrach
and John at the after paying all debts
to wit William Livingston James Livingston
Joseph Livingston William B Livingston
heirs of the body of my daughter Rutha
Davis and my daughter Elizabeth M
Livingstons

Executors hereby Resolving all former wills by me
made In Writing when of I Joseph Livingston
have heretofore by my husband and Seal the 28th day
of July in the year of our lord one thousand
eight hundred and thirty eight and thirty
second year of American Independence

last will and testament in the presence of us

 testament And first of all I commend my soul
 to God and my body to a decent burial and as for
 the good things that God has blest me with my
 Will is that I will just settle the same
 Article 1st I will and bequeath unto my Son
 John S. Reuben one dollar in addition to what he
 has heretofore had

Art. 2nd I will and bequeath unto Austin
 Watt my one in law one dollar in addition to
 what he has heretofore had

Art. 3rd I will and bequeath unto Cephas
 W. Christian my one in law one dollar in
 addition to what he has heretofore had

Art. 4th I will and bequeath unto Abner
 Christian my one in law one dollar in addition to
 what he has heretofore had

Art. 5th My Will is that all my estate be
 sold and after my debts is all paid the bal-
 lance of my estate to be equally divided between
 my wife Mary Ann Christian and Reuben
 S. Christian my Son

Art. 6th My Will is that after the sale and
 division that if my Son Reuben S. Christian
 should not have three hundred dollars that
 the six parts of three hundred dollars should
 be made up to him of the death of my wife
 Mary Ann's portion out of that part of my estate
 left unto her the said Mary Ann And then the
 balance of my estate left unto my wife Mary Ann
 Christian to be equally divided amongst all my
 children

Art. 7th My Will and desire is that Elijah
 W. Christian and Abner Christian be my legal
 Executors to execute this my will

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand and seal this 27th September 1835
