 redemption of my Ecclesiastical enemies after
 my death, and all my truly Esteemed and
 Beloved as follows

And I give and Devise to my Son Robert
being his heir and assigns power all that let
remain of the said debt doth and is sold to my
son Robert & his assigns also his assigns &
by Elias twenty years of age and his
named Heideat about sixteen years of age
and also I give to my son Joseph the largest
the sum of sixty five Dollars and to my
Daughter Elizabeth the sum of the sum
of fifty five Dollars also I give to Robert
& his assigns my shot gun

All Remaining property of every description
situated on the plantation with household
and kitchen furniture as to be and remain
in the present possession of my beloved wife
Elizabeth throughout in lieu of dower, or dower
during her natural life all the Remaining
property at that time of every description is
to be equally divided between the undersigned
brother heirs in their heirs or assigns Sherr
and Sherr a little after paying all Just
debts William Longshaw James Briceston
Joseph Emmiter Melvin & Orman
heirs of the body of my daughter Rutha
and one my daughter Elizabeth W
Crimble

I do hereby appoint my Sons James Livingston Joseph
Livingston and Robert Livingston my lawful
Executors hereby Resolving all former wills by me
made In Witness Whereof I Joseph Livingston
have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 21st Day
of July in the Year of our Lord one Thousand
Eight Hundred and thirty eight and Sixty
second Year of American Independence
Signed Sealed published and delivered by
the above Named Joseph Livingston to be his
last will and testament in the presence of us
who have hereunto subscribed our Names to
witness in the presence of the testator

 I declare solemnly In the name of God I Reuben
 Christian being well in body but
 sound in mind do make this my last will and
 testament And first of all I commend my soul
 to God and my body to a decent burial and as for
 the good things that God has blessed me with my
 Will is that all my just debts be paid for
 Article 2nd I Will and bequeath unto my Son
 John L. Christian one dollar in addition to what he
 has heretofore had

Art. 3rd I will and bequeath unto Austin
 Watt my Son in law one dollar in addition to
 what he has heretofore had

Art. 4th I will and bequeath unto Cephas
 W. Christian my Son in law one dollar in
 addition to what he has heretofore had

Art. 5th I will and bequeath unto Abner
 Christian my Son one dollar in addition to
 what he has heretofore had

Art. 6th My Will is that all my estate be
 sold and after my debts be all paid the balance
 of my estate to be equally divided between
 my Wife Mary Ann Christian and Reuben
 L. Christian my Son

Art. 7th My Will is that after the sale and
 division that if my Son Reuben L. Christian
 should not have three hundred dollars that
 the said sum of three hundred dollars should
 be made up to him of the said of my Wife
 Mary Ann's Christian out of that part of my estate
 left unto her the said Mary Ann And then the
 balance of my estate left unto my Wife Mary Ann
 Christian to be equally divided amongst all my
 children

Art. 8th My Will and desire is that Elijah
 W. Christian and Abner Christian be my legal
 Executors to execute this my will

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand and seal this 25th of September 1835
