this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and
annulling all others heretofore made by me
I am first I am and trust that my body be buried
in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my
circumstances and condition.

I am Second. I give and direct that all my just debts
be paid by my Executors hereinafter named.

I am Third I give and direct to my Granddaughter Salina
McDonal one and a half share of furniture.

I am fourth I give to Asa Brown (my son) one share
- share of furniture also after the special gifts one
seventh part of the balance of my property.

I am fifth I give to David Brown my son one
share called Bith also one seventh part of all my prop-
erty after the special services.

I am sixth I give to Josiah Brown my son one seventh
part of all my property after the above services.

I am seventh I give to Martha Plap (my daughter) &
her husband Andrew Plap one seventh part of all my prop-
erty after the above services.

I am eighth I give to Gladley Hartfield (my daughter)
and her husband Asa J. Hartfield one seventh part of
all my property after the above services.

I am ninth I give to Elizabeth Warr my daughter
& her husband Mr. B. Warr one seventh part of all
my property after the above services.

I am tenth I give to my daughter Lilly Anderson
Wife of Melton McDonald and to her children by
her present or any future husband free from the

disposition of her present or any future husband one seventh
part of all my property after the above services. To my son
Josiah Brown Trustee for the property herein bequeathed to
my daughter Melthy McDonald and her children.

I am Eleventh I constitute and appoint my son Josiah
Brown Executor to this my last Will and Testament
this 21st day of February 1846

and if the negro woman Ann who I have sold proves to be
sound my Wife must have fifty dollars more from my estate
also my Wife must have fifty dollars worth of provisions
to be selected by herself, also the balance of my
estate I wish to be taken possession of by my friends
Silas Starr and Silas Starr junior and by them to be
managed for my children John D & Peter Luke, Silas
W Luke James I Luke William D Luke Benjamin
I Luke according to their judgement.

I appoint my friends Thos. Snoddy, Silas Starr and Silas
Starr junior my executors this 1st day of July 1844

In the name of God Amen I Joseph Pugh of the County
of Newton and State of Georgia, being afflicted in body,
but of sound mind & memory, and calling to mind the
mortality of the body & knowing that it is appointed un-
to all men once to die, do make this my last Will and
testament in manner and form as follows Viz. In the first
place I commit my soul to God who gave it and my bo-
dy to the dust, to be buried in a plain manner and
as touching such worldly substance as hereunto God has been
pleased to bless me I dispose of it in the following man-
ner, namely

To my dearly beloved Wife Eliza Pugh I
give the following property for her use and support dur-
ing her natural life, and at her death to be disposed
of as is herein after mentioned Viz. One, One, Ben,
Lyon, Solomon, Caroline Betty and Lend. Six of the
choicest mules, the stock of cattle & hogs as many planta-
tion tools as will be necessary to carry on her business, my
carriage and Suggy, the wagon and two ox carts and oxen
& also the stock of sheep - And it is further my will
that she have as much of my land in which I live as
she sees proper to cultivate and the use of the dwelling-
house and such other out houses contiguous to the main
dwelling in view of, without rent, the use of all the house-
hold and kitchen furniture spinning machine & cotton gin
during her natural life - except such as are not otherwise
disposed of

To William H. Whiston the following negroes
My Mary and Matilda.

To my son Roller B. Pugh I give the following
negroes viz Susan Susan and Nancy, and also one
fifth of my library
