I Richard Loyall of County of Newton
and State of Georgia being of sound disposing mind and
memory and knowing that death will come, and wishing to
dispose of my property in my own way do make the fol-
lowing as my last will and testament in relation thereto

I Item the first. Do hereby leave to my wife during
her natural life and afterwards all my estate both real
and personal whom convenience that she maintains and con-
ducts my children the maintenance to correspond with
my pecuniary circumstances and the execution at the dis-
cretion of my wife.

I Item the second. It is my will and desire that should
any or all of my children become of age or marry during the
natural life and widowhood of my wife that then and in
that event my said wife may appropriate off property
in kind and value as she may think fit, to such
child becoming of age or marrying.

I Item the third. It is my will and desire that my
wife during her natural life and widowhood shall have
to sell any property of my estate or purchase other prop-
erty as she may desire.

I Item the fourth. It is my will and desire that the
Administrator shall not have any jurisdiction over my estate
or the actions and rights of my representatives during the
natural life or widowhood of my wife only so far as to allow
this will and testament to be regular proven and put
upon the record.

I Item the fifth. It is my will and desire that
upon the death of my wife or upon her marriage that there
be an inventory and appraisement of my estate and that there
be a division of my estate between my wife and my children
each to share and share alike.

I Item the sixth. It is my will and desire that who-
ever property may be set a part to my female children

woman and by virtue of the preceding item that is the fifth item
or what property my wife during her widowhood may appropriate off
to my female children in either event the property to be given
to Laurens Baker in trust for such female child or children
and their heirs.

I Item the seventh. It is my direction in the event my wife
marries that her husband shall not be appointed Guardian of
either of my children and that he shall not in any event have
the control or management of the person or property of either of
my children and that such future husband of my wife shall
not be appointed Administrator with the will annexed of
my estate or have the control thereof by any appointment
under any other name.

I Item the eighth I do hereby appoint my wife Dancy
& Loyall Greenwicks and my half brother Laurens Baker of
Newton County Executor to this my last will and testament
and I do hereby revoke all other wills or codicils.

I In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and

I Item the ninth I do hereby reserve each and all of my
children of any power whatever to sell or convey any part
or portion of the estate designated by this instrument for their
use unless such sale and conveyance be by the concurrence
of the trustee.
