the payment of my debts should be given to my  
beloved wife Jane Grueter.

I wish that my heirs Lamb & Beran of the  
County of Fulton Georgia shall act as my executors  
to carry into effect the Will and Testament.

Item 1st I will & bequeath to my Nellie May D Brown my  
nephew Ben during his life, after his death I wish  
him sold to A master of his own choice / provide a such  
an encouragement can be fairly made, and the proceeds  
of his sale to be given to the Georgia Conference Misch-  
ionary Society for the benefit of Colored missions within  
the Georgia Conference

Item 2d I will & bequeath to my Nellie May D Brown a  
certain lot of land Number Thirty seven Section one  
Eleventh Dist Cherokee and a mother lot number one hun-  
dred and thirty seven twentieth barrel. And whereas I hold  
certain notes on my Mother Mary D Brown amounting  
to three hundred dollars or more it is my wish that in  
case I should die before she does that said notes be given  
to her to be disposed of by her as she may think proper

Item 3d I will and bequeath to Martin M. Hays and  
Ann N. Hays jointly my horses carriage and harness

Item 4th I will and bequeath to Ann M. Hays to  
be interest and keeping of her husband his notes on  
Georgia D. Brown a mounting in principal and interest  
to about one hundred dollars

Item 5th I will and bequeath the balance of my  
notes to my Nellie May D Brown

Item 6th I will and bequeath to Georgia D. Brown and  
Dover P. Brown five dollars each

shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God

I give & bequeath such worldly estate wherewithal it has  
pleased God to bless me with in this life I give demise  
and dispose of the same in the following manner & form

First I give and bequeath my son George Hollingsworth  
all the East part of land lying west of the Spring  
branch also the house and one hectar to be laid out  
to the best convenience of the Spring on the east side the  
hundred of the land with the stock and household and  
Kitchen furniture to be sold by my executors and dis-  
tributed among the children agreeable to a division of  
property made out which each child recd as the man  
recd off this distribution is to commence with them the  
and least making all equal so far as it will go out  
and them that has all ready recd more than the rest can  
get is to help it up their own property I Joseph Hollingsworth  
do make this my last will and do further apprise  
Joseph Hollingsworth Esq and Anna Hollingsworth my execu-  
tors to this my last Will this the 20 of June the year of  
our Lord One thousand eight hundred and thirty nine
