 it my duty to make this my last will and
 testament, namely by these presents to hereby make
 this my last will hereby renouncing all other
 wills by me previously made.
 In the first place I request that all my just
 debts be paid.
 In the second place I give unto my beloved
 wife Rebecca the tract of land I now live
 on during her natural life or wideness.
 And at her death or marriage said tract of
 land to be sold and the proceeds of the same
 to be equally divided between my two chil-
 dren vizt William Spencer and Rachel
 Ann. Also one small log store. The balance
 of my property both real and personal I
 request it to be sold to the highest bidder
 for cash or convenient after my decease
 and the proceeds of the same to be equally
 divided between my said wife or between
 my said two children. In the third place
 I appoint my brother William Stewart my
 lawful executor to this my last will and testa-
 ment.
