 and Elizabeth.
 Item 16th I wish the remaining part of my property equally
 divided between myson Childers and Elizabeth Wood.
 Item 17th It is my wish and desire that myson Emuley
 Childers and Richard W. Wood my son in law, to take
 charge, maintain and support my wife Mary during
 her natural life or widowhood, and for her to
 have two beds and furniture during her widowhood
 Item 18th I nominate and appoint George Ragsdale
 and Richard Cherry, my executor to carry this
 my last will and testament into effect, done

 and my beloved wife, and my will is that William
 Wallis and Mark Polson be my executor to act
 as they think best for the widow and orphans, so as to
 make a support for the widow and orphans and to
 educate the orphans, and my will is further that my
 wife shall give to our children, as they become
 of age or more of so much of the property as the
 executor and my wife shall see that they can tolerate
 to give to all of the rest after raising and edu-
 cating all the rest of the orphans, and a support
 for my wife during her widowhood; and that there
 shall be a yearly kept of all that is given to the
 heirs agreeable to my will.
