my executors until the children become of age
or the girls marry. I wish if my sons should
marry before they become of age that they shall
have a part of their Estate. I want until they
become of age I wish William Garner my
agent son to have his part of the Estate when
he becomes of age and when my son John
Garner becomes of age wish him to have his part
of the Estate and when my daughter Anna Garner
becomes of age or marries she is to have her
part of my Estate and my son Micajah should
have part of my Estate when he becomes of age.
I wish all my estate equally divided.
I do love my beloved wife Martha
Garner and my friend wife Catharine my executors
they my last will and testament
