

Copy of the Last will of Melir Burge and. transposed
from Morgan to Newton County at Sept. Term 1854

In the name of Good Amen I Melir Burge of
the State of Georgia and County of Morgan being in
perfect mind and memory thank he to God. Touching
such worldly Estate which I have placed God to lay
me with, I give devise and dispose of the same in the
following manner.

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife living
all my Estate both real and personal during her na-
tural life or widow here on the following terms Viz
She shall not any power to sell transfer or dispose of
any part thereof of my said Estate, without the consent
of my Executors. It is my will that my sons Thomas
Burge & Wiley Burge, and James Burge at each of
them shall come to the age of Twenty one years, they
and each of them shall have the sum of One Thousand

Dollars in current money of that day or that amount
of any part of my Estate by valuation the property in
each case to be paid or alpy by my Executors, at their
discretion, and each and live and furnished with
also my daughters Eliza Burge and Nancy Burge
at the age of Twenty years each they shall have
the sum of One thousand Dollars current money
of that day, payable to them in the same like man-
ner as is pointed out to my sons with each and live
and furniture. Thirdly it is my will that my

Children namely Wiley Burge Nancy Burge and
James Burge, shall have the following education
Nancy to finish and with Wiley and James nothing
writing and Arithmetic. Fourthly it is my will
that my daughter Patsy and my son

Hamilton Burge neither of them shall have any part
of my Estate, until after the death of my wife or a general
division of the same as I have give each and thousand
dollar hereof

Fifthly It is my will and I do
hereby constitute and appoint Richard Lewis
Hamilton Burge and James Mosely my Executors
and I do hereby give and appoint my said

executors with full power and authority to see
 convey dispose of any part of my estate at any
 time or in any manner, which they the said
 executors may in their opinion think advantageous
 to my estate. Fifthly, It is my will that all
 my estate shall be equally divided between all
 my children at the death of my wife namely
 Patsy Lane wife of George Hamilton Bugee
 Liza Bugee Thomas Bugee Wiley Bugee Nancy
 Bugee and James Bugee. In witness whereof, at the
 last death of my wife, I have signed below, this
 of my children who have a thousand dollars
 given them, shall draw the same it shall be
 given them before such general division and
 then all shall be equal. Witness my hand
