 Susan & Lane, my father Henry Lane near
 the said Town of Covington in Newton County, Geo.
 and my brother in law, Benjamin T. Sanders of
 Montgomery County, Alabama, to be Executors and
 Executors of this my last Will and Testament
 conveying on their full and ample power and
 authority to dispose of, sell and convey any
 or all of my Real Estate, for the purpose
 of making a just and easy distribution
 as herein is expressed, and I hereby expressly
 revoke all and every former will by me
