 health but of sound mind and memory do make and
 constitute and appoint this my last will and testament
 in manner and form following To wit

I give unto my wife Sarah Mullis the plantation
 wherein I now live supposed to be four hundred acres to-
 gether with all the land I now own in my own right
 three negroes to wit Hagan, Emma and Lucy together
 with all my plantation tools hardware and kitchen fur-
 niture my stock of horse cattle hogs and sheep during
 her lifetime or widow-hood provided never the less she is
 to make John Zaphnathpaaneah and William Mul-
 ly my grandson of equal with the fifty-five acres
 of land I have hitherto given to my son Nicholas
 Mullis as they severally survive to the age of twenty-one
 years in said land at a fair valuation taking
 into view the quality of the land given to Nicholas
 and my daughters Mary, Elizabeth, Rebecca, J. Sarah
 A. & Margaret. M., Annah Vanburen, at the death
 or intermarriage of my wife is to be made up equal
 with the above land given to my sons as they
 come of age or marry provided it suits the convenience
 of my wife so to do and my daughter Mary and son
 Zaphnathpaaneah is to have fifty dollars a piece more
 than the rest of my children at the final division of my
 property and at the death or intermarriage of my wife
 all of the property which may be then left is to be
 equally divided between all of my children and I do
 hereby constitute and ordain my wife

my sole Executor of this my last will and testament this 14th
 day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
 and forty Seven sealed and delivered in presence of
 J. L. Baker
