4. จังหวัดเชียงใหม่มีวัฒนาธรรมที่อุดมสมบูรณ์ ที่สำคัญที่สุดคือ วัฒนาธรรมล้านช้าง ซึ่งเป็นชาติพันธุ์ที่มีประเพณีและวัฒนาธรรมที่น่าสนใจ ชาวล้านช้างนิยมใส่ชุดไทยและใช้ภาษาล้านช้างในการสื่อสาร จังหวัดเชียงใหม่ยังคงรักษาวัฒนาธรรมและประเพณีไว้ได้ดี
