Paulding County. In the name of God Amen

I Asa Standish of the County of Paulding and State of Georgia being advanced in years but of sound disposing mind knowing the uncertainty of life and desirous of arranging the disposition after my death of my effects (Real Estate and personal property with which a kind Providence has blessed me do make this my last Will and testament hereby revoking all others.

Item 1<sup>st</sup>  
Item 2<sup>nd</sup>

I Will that all my just debts shall be paid  
I Will that my body be decently buried in my family grave yard in the place as heretofore pointed out by me and commend my soul to God who gave it.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup>

I give and bequeath to my wife Savina Standish during life time in order that she may have a comfortable support the following discribed portion of my real and personal Estate to wit Lots of Land known and distinguished as Numbers Two Hundred and Thirty Three 233, Two Hundred and thirty four 234, Two Hundred and thirty five 235, and three fourth 3/4 of Lot Number Two Hundred and twenty one 221 in the first 1<sup>st</sup> District and third Section 3, the last named being the South of same to be cut off by a line square across said Lot all containing One Hundred and fifty acres more or less it is my will that I shall have bread stuff to wit Sugar and Coffee enough for one years comfortable support for myself or in place thereof One Thousand Dollars in gold or its equal in the common currency of the County she to make her election and choice of the kind of provisions or the kind of Currency according as her choice of either. Many or provision may be made and the following named live stock on good ploughs. Cows mare or milk as preferred by her one cow and calf breeding sow with corn fodder and huckle for one support of same and two Cows of live swine of same she to take her choice of such named stock may be owned by me at the time of my decease.

Case of Misfortune or otherwise I should not own  
either as any of said discontents of live stock than the  
bequest to be purchased of time to time  
of this my Will that she should have all the  
poultry also the following named articles of House  
hold and kitchen furniture to wit Two bedsteads two feather  
bed with Customary Summer and winter furniture for same  
One Clock One Bureau One provision safe one side board  
One looking glass One spinning wheel One loom one pair  
cards all my table utensils and vessels One chest Two tables six  
Chairs Two Smoking Varns One Well bucket and rope one coffee  
mill One Coffee pot One pair of Shovel and tongs such cooking  
and washing utensils and vessels as I may possess at my death  
One flour and meal barrel One tin Cufe pan, bread tray and  
water bucket One Houghs Stock with three yalough shares one set  
Rough gear and wedding too It is my Will that my wife shall  
have her choice of bedsteads beds and furniture for same as  
named to meet my bequest in this respects also of any other  
article named where I may die possessed of two or more  
of the same It is my Will that such of the property as named  
in my bequest to my wife as may not be consumed or worn  
out of use for her comfortable support for the remainder of her  
life shall at her death more and come to the possession and  
ownership of my son Joshua Wilburin Hendrick

I give and bequeath to Amanda Hendrick Widow of my son  
Charles Hamilton Hendrick Five dollars and give and  
bequeath to Edward Young Hendrick twenty dollars and to  
Jacob Fuller Hendrick twenty dollars and to  
Sarina Elizabeth  
Hendrick twenty dollars the last last named being children of  
Amanda Hendrick

I give and bequeath to my son Joshua Wilburin Hendrick  
all the remainder of my real and personal estate which may  
be left after satisfying and meeting the bequests hereof and  
hereafter named It is my request and desire that he shall see  
that the comfort of his mother is attended to and her general  
welfare be not neglected The personal estate to include my money  
notes and accounts

I give and bequeath to Sarah Jane Green five dollars I give  
and bequeath to my grand son Thomas Asbury Hendrick  
fifty dollars also one feather bed and Customary Summer  
and winter furniture for same being the next choice  
after the two named in the bequest to my wife It is my  
Will that the bequest named in item fourth and fifth be  
paid in the Common Currency of our County to be  
understood as the Common Circulating Currency of our  
County at the time of payment

I hereby constitute and appoint my son Joshua Wilburin  
Hendrick and Josiah Reiss Hunt both of the County and State  
aforesaid Executors of this my last Will and Testament  
Signed by my hand under Seal this the seventeenth day of August  
in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty seven
