1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition in life My Soul I trust shall return to Rest with God Who gave it and I hope for salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ

2d I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my executors herein after named

Third I give bequeath and devise to my beloved Son James Adair all the property that I am now
