State of Georgia Paulding County

Know all men by these presents, that we George W. Johnson principal and Solomon L. Shirkland security are duly and jointly bound unto the Ordinary of said County and his successors in office in the just and full sum of five hundred dollars for the payment of which sum to the said Ordinary and his successors in office we bind ourselves our heirs Executors and administrators in the whole, and for the whole sum jointly and severally and firmly, by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 2nd day of January eighteen hundred and fifty four.

The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound George W. Johnson Administrator of the goods chattels and credits of John Johnson late of this County deceased do make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods chattels and credits both real and personal of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said George W. Johnson or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him, and the same to make he exhibit to the Court of Ordinary of said County, when he shall be thereunto required and such goods chattels and credits do well and truly administer according to law and do make a just and true account of his doings and doings thereof when required by the Superior Court or Ordinary of said County and all the rest of the goods chattels and credits to the real and personal which shall be found remaining under the account of the said administration the same being first allowed by the Court of Ordinary of said County, shall deliver and pay to such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by law and if it shall hereafter appear that any trust with any testament was made by the said deceased and the same be proved before the Court and the Executors obtain a Certificate of the prelate thereof and the said George W. Johnson do in such case if required ~~make and deliver up to the Court of Ordinary~~ ^{submit} letters of administration then this obligation to be paid ^{shall} remain in full force.
