I, Charles W. White
in the name of God, Amen. I, Charles
White of the County of Paulding, Georgia, being
of sound mind and memory, and considering the
uncertainty of life, do hereby make, ordain, publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament,
(that is to say):

First, I desire my real estate to be sold in one and two
years credit, my Executor therein appointed, giving his
bond for full and sufficient security, and two good securities.
My negro woman Anne, of about sixteen
years of age, I desire sold to the highest bidder at the time of the
next house at Dallas, one year credit, my Executor requiring
sufficient good and approved security.

I desire that my Hogs, cattle, and Crops now on the ground, be sold
first allowing my wife Patsy a twelve months support, and that
the said Horses, Hogs, cattle and crops be sold on a six months credit.
my executor requiring notes and approved securities. And out of the
first money collected, I desire that all my last debts be paid,
the balance to remain in my executors hands until One Thousand
dollars be collected, which is to be and remain in the hands of
my son Wesley H. Roberts for the support of my wife, Patsy
during her life or Widowhood, upon the said Wesley H. Roberts
giving bond and security for the above One Thousand Dollars.
at my wife's death or marriage and to advance the interest of
the sum of money above mentioned annually for the support of
my wife Patsy, but if any accident should happen to her, she is
not to suffer as long as the One Thousand Dollars last, (except she
should marry) and I desire that my executor retain in his hands
(first paying my last debts and reserving the One Thousand
dollars as aforesaid) One Hundred dollars to be divided among
my three grand children to wit, fifty dollars to Wesley H. Roberts
when he shall become of age or marry and twenty five dollars to
Emily Elizabeth Butler when she shall come of age or marry
and twenty five dollars to Loten Marston Butler when he shall
come of age or marry, to be loaned out by my executor at
interest until my said grand children above mentioned shall
arrive at age or marry, then the principal with what interest
it may draw to be paid as above desired. The balance of any
to be equally divided among my five children to wit Elly
Ketchum, wife of John Ketchum, Henry Ketchum, wife of Jack-
son Ketchum, Susannah Glanville, wife of Thomas Glanville,
Wesley H. Roberts and Sarah Rose wife of Matthew Rose.
And at the death or marriage of my wife Patsy, the One Thousand
Dollars set apart for her maintenance, being left to be equally
divided my five children last above mentioned. And I also
desire that my wife Patsy have one further bed and furniture
which I omitted to mention in its proper place and that my
wife Patsy is at liberty to use or dispose of what House hold and
kitchen furniture I am possessed of.

I hereby appoint my son Wesley
H. Roberts my sole executor of this my last Will and Testament
And I hereby forever revoke all other Wills heretofore made by me
in writing whereof I have heretofore subscribed my
and affixed my seal, this the twenty third day of August, in the year
of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty
