

WILL OF HELEN MATTHEWS WRIGHT

PEACH COUNTY

I, Helen Matthews Wright, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, and realizing the uncertainty of life, do hereby and by these presents make, constitute, and publish this last will and testament, hereby revoking any and all other wills heretofore made by me.

Item One (1)

I bequeath and devise unto my four grandchildren hereinafter named in this ten one (1) of this will, namely Martha Wright, Barbara Wright, George William Wright and Virginia Wright the sum of \$100.00 each.

Item Two (2)

I have prepared two written lists, one addressed to Mrs. Patsy Wright, wife of my son George Wright, and the other addressed to Mrs. Ollie Belle Wright, wife of my son William E. Wright. One of these lists is to be found in my cedar chest and the other in my trunk. These lists are signed by me and designate to whom I desire the personal property described in them to belong after my death. These lists I refer to and desire to confirm by this will as part of my testament with reference to these articles of personal property.

Item Three (3)

The contents of the cedar chest and the chest itself I give to my daughter-in-law, Hughie Lee Wright, and the contents of the trunk and the trunk itself I give to my other daughter-in-law, Edith Lee Wright.

Item Four(4)

unto Warren Hill, of Peach County, Georgia, my faithful servant for many years, I will and bequeath the sum of \$50.00.

Item Five (5)

All my other property of every kind not specially devised herein I devise and bequeath as follows:

One half to be divided between the children of my son, George O. Wright, share and share alike. The other half to be divided among the children of my son, William M. Wright, one half of this portion to belong to Helen, and the other half to belong to Martha and Virginia, one share and share alike, or one fourth of this portion ~~xxx~~ each.

Item Six (6)

I nominate, constitute and appoint as executors of this my will my two sons George O. Wright and William Mathews Wright. I expressly relieve them from the necessity of giving bond or of making any returns of their actings and goings to any Court whatsoever. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the sixth (6th) day of May, Nineteen Hundred and twenty-seven (1927).

ITEM ONE.

I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christianlike manner, suitable to my condition and circumstances in life.

ITEM TWO

I give and devise to my beloved wife, Suluka Youngblood Holmes, the residence wherein I now reside, known as No. 523 S. Macon St., in the City of Fort Valley, Georgia, being situate on lots Five and Six (5& 6) of Block 3, Fagan's Addition to the city of Ft. Valley, Georgia, the same to be hers absolutely and in fee-simple.

ITEM THREE

I give and devise to my daughter Grace lot number Three (3); to my son William Andrew, lot number Four(4); to my son Richard Grover, lot number seven(7); to my daughter, Yolanda, lot number Eight (8), all of said lots being in Block Number Three (3) of Fagan's Addition to the City of Fort Valley, Houston County, Georgia, said respective lots to be their absolutely and in fee-simple.

ITEM FOUR

I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife, above named, and to my children now in being and to such others as may be begotten of our union, all the rest and residue of my estate, both real and personal, of every sort whatsoever, and wheresoever situate, not hereinbefore specifically bequeathed or devised, my said wife to take one-half of the same and the balance to be equally divided among my said children.
