

WILL OF H. L. AULTMAN

GEORGIA, PEACH COUNTY.

I, H. L. Aultman, of said State and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do hereby make, declare and publish this my last will and testament.

Item 1. It is my will and desire that all my just and legal debts, if any be due, be paid as early as is practicable after my death and I hereby charge my executor hereinafter named with this duty.

Item 2. In view of the fact that I have already given to my present wife, Mrs.

Mattie Kate Vinson Aultman, the sum of twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) in cash since our marriage in September, 1926, and it being my intention that this should be her share of my estate, and feeling that it is a just and adequate share thereof, I do not will, devise or bequeath to my said wife anything in this will, other than the automobile that I may own and possess at my death. If I should own an automobile at my death, I will and bequeath said automobile to my said wife, Mrs. Mattie Kate Vinson Aultman, and I do not will her anything else, as I feel that I have amply provided for her.

Item 3. It is my will and desire that all my property and effects, including all the property of every kind and nature that I may own at my death, except the automobile as referred to in the foregoing paragraph, be sold by my executor, at either private or public sale, as my said executor shall deem best, and the proceeds thereof together with such cash as I may have I will, devise and bequeath as follows: To my daughter, Mrs. Daisy Aultman Langston, I will, devise and bequeath two-thirds thereof; and to my son Marray Aultman, I will, devise and bequeath one-third thereof, to be and remain theirs forever in fee simple.

Item 4. I hereby nominate and appoint my daughter, Mrs. Daisy Aultman Langston, as executor of this my last will and testament, and I hereby expressly relieve her of giving any bond and of making any inventory and appraisement of my estate and of making any return of her acts and doings to any Court or officer.
