Item Fourth.

I give all of the residue of my estate, of whatever it may consist or where ever located, to the legatees named in the second item of this will, with the same provisions as to taking the share of deceased parents as specified in Item Third of this will above. The residuary legatees to take such residue, share and share alike.

Item Fifth.

I nominate and appoint my friend, A. J. Riley of Ft. Valley Ga. the executor of this my last will and testament, and relieve him from making bond, and from making any inventory of my estate and from making annual returns, except as he may desire; I give him full power to sell any or all of my property, at public or private sale, to pay debts or for distribution, and to my legacies, without any order of any court, and if he shall depart this life or if for any good reason he is unable to act as such executor, then I nominate and appoint in his stead the son of my friend, A. J. Riley Jr. as such executor and clothe him with like powers as given to said A. J. Riley, his father. My executor to receive \$100.00 in full for all of his services.
