ITEM FIRST-

It is my will and desire that all of my just debts be paid as soon as practicable after my death.

ITEM SECOND-

I will, bequeath and devise unto my wife, Helen Economou and my daughter, Anne Economou, the sum of \$1.00 (One Dollar), each.

ITEM THIRD-

I will, bequeath and devise unto my son, Nick Economou all the balance and residue of my property, both real and personal, of whatever kind and wherever situated, to be his absolutely and in fee simple forever.

ITEM FOURTH-

I hereby make and appoint my son, Nick Economou executor of this my last will and testament, and I relieve him from making any inventory of my property or appraisement thereof, or from giving any bond, and he is required by this will to probate the same, only, and he is further relieved from making any returns of his acts or doings to any Court whatever.
