I, Mattie L. Skellie, do make declare and publish this as my last will and testament, hereby revoking and annulling all wills and codicils to the same at any time heretofore made by me.

Item First.

I give to my son, P. H. Skellie, my gold brooch and chain, the same being the gold brooch with the tassel attached.

I give to Mrs. Berte Holt and Mrs. Nina Hartley such of my wearing apparel as they may desire and all of the same that they do not want I give to my old cook Winnie Preston of Fort Valley Ga.

Item Third.

All of the residue of my property, real and personal, of every nature, wherever

located, I give, beneath an devise to my sons, E. A. Skellie, and P. H. Skellie and to my
 grandson, P. H. Skellie, Jr., share and share alike.
 I nominate and appoint my brother, Frank Holt, of Montezuma Ga. the executor of this my last
 will and testament: relieving him from giving any bond or such and from making any inventory
 of my estate and from making any returns annual or otherwise, except as may desire to make
 for his own protection and satisfaction.
