State of Georgia-Houston County:

In the name of God, Amen:

I, J. M. Jones of said state and county, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do
 make declare and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and annulling all
 wills heretofore made by me, together with any codicils to the same at any time heretofore
 made by me.

Item First:

I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christianlike manner,
 suitable to my circumstances and my condition in life.

Item Second:

I desire and direct that all of my just debts, should I owe any debts at the time
 of my death, be paid with as little delay as possible by my executrix hereinafter named and
 appointed.

Item Third:

I give to each of my children, to-wit,

Jennie May Jones Prator, Annie Pearl Jones Prator, Robert Tyler Jones, Elsie Louise Jones,
 Samuel Livingston Jones, five dollars, with my blessing, and commend them to the love and care
 of their mother.

Item Fourth:

I give, bequeath and devise to my wife, Annie T. Jones, all of the property of
 every description, real, personal and choses in action, of which I may die seized and poss-
 essed.

Item Fifth:

I hereby constitute and appoint my wife, Annie T. Jones, the sole executrix of
 this, my last will and testamnet, and I expressly confer on her the power, as such to admin-
 ister my estate, excusing her from giving bond, or making any returns to the ordinary or
 other court, either annual or otherwise, together with the power to sell any part or all of
