Item Third:

Jennie May Jones Prator, Annie Pearl Jones Prator, Robert Tyler Jones, Elsie Louise Jones, Samuel Livingston Jones, five dollars, with my blessing, and commend them to the love and care of their mother.

Item Fourth:

I give, bequeath and devise to my wife, Annie T. Jones, all of the property of every description, real, personal and choses in action, of which I may die seized and possessed.

Item Fifth:

I hereby constitute and appoint my wife, Annie T. Jones, the sole executrix of this, my last will and testamnet, and I expressly confer on her the power, as such to administer my estate, excusing her from giving bond, or making any returns to the ordinary or other court, either annual or otherwise, together with the power to sell any part or all of my property as ~~xxxxx~~ she sees proper, without any order of court first had, either at public or private sale. I also relieve her from making any inventory of my estate.
