this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking
and annulling all others heretofore made by me
I do desire and direct that my body
be buried in a decent and Christian like manner
suitable to my circumstances and condition
My soul I trust shall return to rest with God
who gave it -

I do second desire and direct that all my
just debts be paid without delay by my wife
Cassandra R. Smith as I am unwilling my
creditors should be delayed of their rights
especially as there is no necessity for delay
I do then give devise to my beloved wife
Cassandra R. with whom I have lived in the
strictest quiet and love for twenty six years
during her natural life Lot of Land containing
Eighty Six (86) in the twenty third (23) District
and Second (2) section of said County and
State containing one hundred and sixty acres
about Eighty acres of which is cleared and
in cultivation and her death. I desire that
said Lot of Land be sold and the proceeds
be equally divided among my children I also
give and bequeath to my beloved wife
Cassandra R. with all my other property all my
