 annulling all others heretofore made by me
 Item 1st

I desire that my body be buried in a decent
 Christian like manner my soul I trust will return to
 rest with God who gave it as I trust for salvation
 alone through the atonement of Jesus Christ
 Item 2nd

I give devise and bequeath to my three daughters
 Margaret A Fountain Mary E Mullins and Martha
 J Mullins my land to wit 40 Acres more or less of
 Lot of land No 127 in 12th District and 2nd Section being
 that portion of said lot whereon I now reside which
 is marked by posts and boards. for and during their
 natural lives and if either one should die then her
 portion to vest in the others two living and upon the
 death of two of them then their portion to vest in
 the one living it being my intention that the land
 shall remain in the one living until her
 natural death and upon the death of all three
 of them then to be sold and equally divided
 amongst my children and Representatives of my
 children.

Item 3rd I give bequeath and devise
 to my three unmarried daughters to wit
 Margaret A Fountain Mary E Mullins and
 Martha J Mullins all of my property of every
 description to wit two Acres hogs Sheep
 Cows Pooder wheat oats rye Shucks
 household and kitchen furniture.

of every description together with farming Tools
money notes & accounts. all to go, best and pass to
each with the same condition and restriction
as the land named in the 2nd item of this
will. My reason for giving my little property
to my three daughters as above is that they have
taken care of me in my old age and are
unable to live without the little home
while my other children and grand
children can.

Item 4th
I do hereby constitute and
appoint my two Sons William F. Mullins
and Alfred W. Mullins Executors of this
my last will and testament
Witness my hand and Seal this 30th day of
August 1873 John M. Mullins *ED*
