 ence, has blessed me do Therefore make this my last
 will and testament hereby revoking all others heretofore
 made by me.

Item 1st I desire that my body be buried in
 the Grave yard by my husband near Cool
 Spring Church suitable to my Circumstances
 and condition in life in a Decent Christian
 like manner, my Soul I trust will return to
 God who gave it.

Item 2nd I desire and direct That my Executors
 herein after named and appointed pay all
 my just debts without any unnecessary delay

Item 3rd I Give and bequeath to my son
 Stephen Griffith five dollars, to my son
 John H Griffith five dollars, to my daughter
 Julia A Goode five dollars to my daughter
 Ellynder Taylor five dollars to my daughters
 children Cary A Goode five dollars to
 be paid to Abraham Goode for their use

Item 4th I Give and bequeath and devise
 to my son Caleb Griffith lot of Land
 number Three hundred and five (305) lying and
 being in the twelfth (12) District and second (2)
 Section of Pickens County, State of Georgia
 and all my personal property of every
 description, Including all judgments notes
 accounts and money that I

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May be seized and possessed except
that portion willed in the (3) item
of this will

Item 5th I desire and direct that there
be no inventory and appraisement
of my property and return to the
Ordinary but be applied and title
to pass as directed in Items (3) and
(4) of this will without inventory or sale

Item 6th I do hereby constitute and appoint
John W. Griffith and Leath Jones my
Executors of this my last will and
testament This the fifteenth of January
1878.
