 County being of sound disposing mind and
 memory, and knowing the uncertainty of
 human life deem it both right and proper
 as respects my family and myself, that I should
 make a disposition of the property with which a
 kind Providence has blessed me, and further
 desiring to make that disposition of my property
 as my judgment and affections dictate, I
 do therefore make and declare this my last
 Will and Testament hereby revoking and
 cancelling all others heretofore made by me,
 Item 1st I desire my body to be buried in a
 Deep & Clean like manner suitable to my
 condition and circumstances in life, and my
 soul my soul I trust that hope will return to
 rest with God who gave it, I have verolly men-
 tioned my preference as to the place where my
 body should be buried,

Item 2nd I desire and direct that all my just debts
 be paid without any unnecessary delay by
 my executors herein after named and
 appointed,

Item 3rd I give bequeath and devise to my beloved
 wife, Polly all that portions of lots of land
 number one hundred and seventy four (174)
 One hundred and eight (158) One
 hundred and forty seven (147) and that portion
 of lot one hundred and twenty (120) lying
 in what is called the Taxonfield including
 what is known and called Persimmon
 Bottom and Stony Creek together with all
 that portion of said field lying east of a
 line running at a hedge across the

ditch where a poplar tree stands thereon
 strait line to the townfield. And all said
 portion of said lots lying west of long swamp
 Creek and all in the fourth district and
 second section of Pickens County state of
 Georgia together with all the rights and appur-
 tenances connected therewith or thereto
 belonging to have and to hold for and
 during her natural life, the rents and
 profits of every character being hers in fee
 simple during her natural life. I also give
 and bequeath to my said wife all of my
 stock of hogs, cattle, sheep, and two
 mules or horses for her to take her choice
 I also give and bequeath to my beloved
 wife all the household and kitchen furni-
 ture, of every description. Also all my farm-
 tools Blacksmith Tools, wagons, carts, traps,
 Poultry &c for her own proper use benefit
 and behoof forever in fee simple and
 direct and require my executors herein
 after named and appointed not to have the
 same appraised sold or in any way ex-
 pected or meddled with;

Item 4th I give bequeath devise to my three
 sons Leake P. Tate William Tate the sum
 to Tate the following lots or tract of land to
 wit Number one hundred and seventeen
 (117) One hundred and eighteen (118) one
 hundred and nineteen (119) one hundred
 and twenty (120) One hundred and twenty
 (121) One hundred and forty six (146) one
 hundred and forty seven (147) one hundred
 and forty nine (149) One hundred and
 eight (108) Pickens County Wills 1854-1887

hundred and eighty-four (184) one
hundred and eighty-six (186) one hundred
and eighty-seven (187) Eighty (80) Eighty-one
(81) and that portion of lot of land number
seventy-nine (79) lying east of Old Federal
Road all lying and being in Fourth Dis-
trict and Second Section of Pickens County
and State of Georgia at and after the
Expiration of the life estate given to my
wife in that portions of lots number one
hundred and forty-seven (147) One hundred
and forty-six (146) One hundred and fifty-
Eight (158) One hundred and Eighty-four
(184) And one hundred and Twenty (120)
here right to take effect after her death
to the last mentioned lot of land as descri-
bed in Item Three all three being equal
except that portion or interest willed to
Leahb N Tate to be limited to him during
his natural life to enjoy equal privileges
to said land with all their appurtenances
with William and Stephen C Tate during
his natural life except leasing and selling
his portion which he can not do without
the consent of both William and Stephen C
Tate or their representatives, and at said
Leahb N Tate's death the portion or interest
willed to him in the lands, to go to and
rest in William Tate and Stephen C Tate or
their lawful heirs,

Item 34 I also give bequeath and devise to my
son Leahb N Tate all my Town property in the
Village of Jasper Pickens County State of
Georgia Consisting of houses and lots.

Item 6th I give bequeath and devise to my daughter Martha Hockett Maddox the following described lands to wit lot number one hundred and fifty seven (157) one hundred and eighty four (184) in the fifth district and second section of said County of Pickens State of Georgia not subject to or liable to the debts or liabilities of her present or any future Husband, but solely to her and her Children's use;

Item 7th I give bequeath and devise to my Daughter to Sophrony Davis my Town lot with appurtenances in the town of Cartersville Bartow County State of Georgia free from the debts of her present or any future Husband, but solely to her and her Children's use;

Item 8th I give bequeath and Devise to Julian Davis my daughter my Gold watch.

Item 9th I give bequeath and devise to my wife Polly Tate all monies notes accounts or other obligations of debt to her own proper use and benefit;

Item 10th I desire and direct my executors herein named and appointed to sell all the lands houses and property of every description that I die seized or possessed of in any way not otherwise disposed of in this will and I hereby direct said Executors to divide the money arising from the sale of said property equally between Martha Hockett Maddox and Sophrony Davis,

Item 11th I hereby constitute and appoint my two Sons William Tate and Stephen Tate my sole executors with this 1883 my last will
