Sarah Ann Elizabeth Anderson, Lot of land
two hundred and seventy four in the
twenty fourth district and second section
of Pickens County containing one hundred
and sixty acres more or less, with all the
rights members and appurtenances to said
lot of land in any way belonging free from
all charge limitation whatever to her own
proper use benefit and behoof forever with
full power to control during her natural
life or her widow hood; if the said Sarah Ann
E Anderson should remain then the said
lot of land to fall to my heirs, I also give
and bequeath to my beloved wife in
the same unreserved manner a fraction
part lot of land No 303 in the 24 Dist and
2^d section sixteen acres more or less, also
one milk one cow, six head of hogs, and
all my household and kitchen furniture
also six hundred dollars in money and
notes, I give the above property to my
beloved wife to have full control of the said
real and personal property, and money

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And Note and act to use and control
as she thinks best for the family during her
lifetime provided she does not remarry, and if she
does then the property and money what is on
hand to be equal divided between my heirs.
