 make a disposition of the property which I
 have Providence has blessed me with so therefore make
 this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking
 and annulling all others by me heretofore made

First I desire and direct that my body be buried in a
 decent Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances
 and condition in life; My soul I trust shall return to
 rest with God who gave it I hope for salvation through
 the merits and atonement of His only Son Lord and
 Saviour Jesus Christ;

Second I desire and direct that all my just debts be
 paid without delay by my executors herein after
 named and appointed;

Thirdly I give be devise and devise to my beloved wife
 Salicy Taylor during her natural life time and then
 to go to my son Washington J. Taylor during his
 said Washington J. Taylor's natural life then to
 go and number one hundred and twenty one and
 number two hundred and eight said two lots of land
 lying and being in the Mountain District and second
 section originally theretofore in Pickens County
 and State of Georgia containing One hundred & six ^{Acres}
 according to the original Survey and including the
 House and cleared land and improvements of
 all kinds where I now reside in Pickens County
 and State of Georgia;

4 I also give to my beloved wife Salicy during her
 natural life time all my house hold and Kitchen

attached thereto and all my stock, horses cows hogs
 sheep goats and fowls and all my farming utensils
 of all kinds and it is my will and desire that all things
 here mentioned after the death of my wife Sally Taylor
 that it then go to my son Washington J. Taylor to hold
 during his natural life and after my death if any money
 then on hand I give it to said Washington J. Taylor
 for his support and I will also that after my
 death and the death of my wife Sally Taylor and
 also the death of my son Washington J. Taylor that
 then my Executors as herein after named at discre-
 tion by sale or to divide if they think best the then
 proceeds of my estate as may be right and just with
 my three daughters now in life Lucinda McLean
 wife of Willie McLean and Malinda Timmons
 wife of William L. Timmons and Elizabeth Dooley
 wife of Michael Dooley and Lucinda H. Taylor and the
 female orphan according to law to Mary Milkey's
 children when they come of age and also my four
 grand children the children of the late Garrett
 H. Taylor and also the three children of Augustus
 H. Taylor and it is my will and I do bequeath the
 entire proceeds of my estate as first mentioned that
 after my death and the death of my wife Sally
 Taylor and my son Washington J. Taylor that then
 my Executors give my children named now in life
 the shares and my Grand children that is their
 parents that is dead get one share in behalf of
 my Grand children and the living children two
 shares that is double and I do constitute and
 appoint, Wiers H. Taylor and Willie McLean
 and William L. Timmons Executors of this my last
 Will and Testament This 23rd day of
 January 1866.
