Know all men by these presents that this is my last will and testament, and that I have no other.

Firstly, I wish all my just and honest debts to be paid

Secondly, My Brother, John W. Taylor and myself being joint heirs in a tract of Land, and there being no written settlement between us, have mutually agreed to divide said land, for which division when made, I promise and wish to be paid to the said John W. Taylor, one hundred and fifty Dollars. After such Settlement and payment of said money, I am to give said John W. Taylor a deed for his portion of the Land, I holding at present, the deed for the whole lot. The above my Executor will attend to as soon as it can be done according to law

Thirdly, After the above I will and bequeath to my beloved wife, Eveline, and my dear children all the balance of my property. I also hereby appoint, Ebert B. Wheeler, my Executor of this my last Will and testament

E. L. Newsenbury, one of the Subscribing Witnesses to the last Will and testament of Thomas J. Taylor deceased, appeared in open court, and after being duly sworn deposes and saith that the said Will was executed in the County of Pickens and State of Georgia. Said Testator being a single man, at the

time of his decease; and that he saw the testator assign, and publish this instrument of writing, which is now in court, as his last will and testament, and that he subscribed the same at his special request and in his presence, and that David Turner subscribed the said will in my presence and in the presence, and at the request of the testator, and in further deposite and faith that said testator at the time of assigning and publishing his said Will, was of sound disposing mind and memory, and that he was not wrought upon by any undue influence; but that he assigned and published this as his last Will and testament of his own free will and accord.
