 has blessed me, I do therefore make this my last will
 and Testament hereby Revoking and annulling all others
 by me heretofore made,

First I desire that my body be buried in a decent &
 Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances
 and condition in life my soul I trust shall return to
 rest with God who save it as I hope for salvation
 through the merits and atonement of the blessed
 Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Second I desire and direct that all my book debts
 be paid without delay by my Executors herein after
 named & I hereby release them from all such debts.

Third, I do hereby give devise bequeath to my beloved
 wife Caroline Twenty acres of lot of land numbered
 twenty one (21) in the fifth (5) District of original
 settling, now Pierce County all the rights and interest
 appertaining to said body or parcel of land in any wise
 belonging free from all charges and limitations whatever
 To her own proper use benefit and behoof forever with
 full power to dispose of the same by will or otherwise
 as she may deem proper, I also give and bequeath
 to my beloved wife in the same reserved manner
 the farming utensils used on or belonging to the farm
 on said parcel of land and forty three (43) head
 of stock cattle [excepting one certain red spotted
 Cow and her calf included in the above number
 which I desire and direct to go to the benefit of my
 grand son Owen now about eight years old]
 Two Hares, thirty head of stock hogs, fifteen bee
 hives and all my poultry consisting of geese ducks
 and chickens and all my crops and all other
 personal property and all household and
 kitchen furniture without limitation or
 reserve,
