In the name of God Amen Thomas
Grannell of the State of Georgia Pitt County being
weak in body but of sound memory thanks be to
God but calling to mind the mortality of my
body and knowing that it is appointed for all men
once to die, do make and ordain this my last will
and testament - as touching such worldly estate
whereinwith it has pleased God to bless me in this life
first of all I desire that all my just debts should
be paid - I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
our tract of land wherein she now lives also my
house and furniture - also our negro man named
Jack - our negro woman named Mary, our negro
boy named Milton - our negro girl named Edy -
our negro girl named Eliza - our negro boy named
America - also our negro man named Antony to
work the ensuing year 1825 also my stock of cattle
also my stock of hogs, also our yoke of oxen, also two
horses, also I desire that my son Drachford Grannell
should live on the said tract of land during his lifetime
and at his wife's decease for the said tract of land
and equally to be divided among my children -
I also give unto John Grannell my oldest son an
negro boy named Dennis also our negro girl named
Milly 2nd I also give unto Benjamin Grannell
my son our negro boy named Balaam
3rd I also give unto my daughter Nancy Stroud our
negro boy named Antony after the ensuing crop 1825
4th I also give unto daughter Milly Stroud our negro
girl named Jenny
5th I also give unto my son Drachford Grannell our
negro man named Henry - I also have favored

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and maner and all the goods and chattels that
I possess to be sold what corn and every thing else
whenever pertaining therunto excepting those above
mentioned for my beloved wife
I also give my daughter Nancy Stroud and my
woman named Phillis and her child named Charles
I also do appoint John Trammell and John Harris
Trammell my two sons to be my executors his
Thomas & Trammell
