Will

State of Georgia In the Name of God Amund
Polk County of Alexander R. Brooks of said State and County being of advanced age
but of sound and disposing mind and memory and deeming it right and proper
both as to myself and family to make a disposition of the property with which a kind
Providence has blessed me while in life and able so to do hereby revoking all other
wills heretofore made by me

Item 1st I desire and direct that after my death that my body be Buried in a decent and Christian
like manner my soul I trust shall return to meet with God who gave it.

Item 2nd I desire and direct that all my just debts, if any, at my death be paid as early as possible
by my Executors and Executors herein after named.

Item 3rd I desire and direct and hereby bequeath to my wife Ann B. Brooks all my property and effects of
every kind for her and my minor childrens joint use and benefit until my youngest child
shall arrive to twenty one years of age or during the widowhood of my said wife and in
case that my wife should marry before my youngest child arrives to twenty one years
then and in that event I direct that my said Property be kept together as before stated and to
be managed by my Executors for the use of my minor children during their minority
my wife to have the management of running my farm and other matters that she may be able
to attend to, but my other Executors to be principals and she to be governed by direction of
my other Executors

Item 4th It is my will and desire that when my youngest child shall arrive to the age of twenty
one years that all my property be sold and the Proceeds thereof equally divided between
my wife and all my children, if she shall remain single and be then living share and
share alike, except my sons Robert L. Brooks and William H. Brooks whom I direct
to have only twenty five Dollars each showing showing heretofore advanced to them
their freedom and maintenance which will make them equal with the Balance of my
children. I also direct that my daughter Francis A. Ward account to my Estate
out of her share for the sum of one hundred and fifty Dollars which I have heretofore
advanced to her and I also direct that my son John L. Brooks account to my Estate
out of his share for the sum of two hundred Dollars which I have heretofore advanced
to him

Item 5th I hereby Ordain Constitute and appoint my beloved wife Ann B. Brooks Executors
and my friend John L. Heard and my son John L. Brooks Executors of this my
last will and testament this the 28th day of May 1885
