Polk County dispoising mind and memory knowing that I must shortly depart this life deem it right and proper both as respect
my family & myself that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind providence has blessed me. I do therefore make
this my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made.

First I devise and direct that my body be buried in a decent and christian like manner suitable to my Circumstances and Constitution
in life and that the Expenses thereof together with all my just debts be paid without delay.

Second I give bequeath and devise to my beloved son John G. Lumpkin all that may be left of my property both real and personal as
well as all actions in chase that may be found in my estate at my death.

Third I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved son John G. Lumpkin Executor of this my last will and testament this 14th day of March 1876.
