in life and that the expenses thereof together with all my just debts be paid without delay.

Second I give bequeath and devise to my beloved son John G. Lumpkin all that may be left of my property both real and personal as
well as all actions in chace that may be found in my estate at my death

Third I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved son John G. Lumpkin Executor of this my last will and testament this 14th day of March 1876
