

Georgia Hancock County. I Benjamin J. Mosley of Polk County Georgia do publish and declare
this my last will and Testament as follows to wit.

Item 1st

I bequeath to my wife Mary Ann Mosley the following negroes Lewis Greer, Sarah and her natural
Increase, Lydia and her natural increase to have and to enjoy forever also the sum of Twelve
Hundred Dollars without Restriction with Interest from this date

Item 2^d

To my children Benjamin J. Mosley, Madison G. Mosley and to such others if any that may hereafter be
born to me I bequeath all my interest and legacy in and by Virtue of my said Polly Mosley's Will
late of Pontaton deceased to be equally divided between my children Susan & Susan Eliza subject
to the Charge and Limitation herein after mentioned.

Item 3^d

To my wife and children that now are or may hereafter be born to me I bequeath all my interest
in any and all lands lying in the States of Mississippi Tennessee and Alabama, a part of said
lands were entered by me at the land office at Pontatoc in the State of Mississippi said entry
said entry being in the name of Abraham James Elmer of Penfield of Green County Georgia but now deceased
and a further part thereof was purchased by me from John H. Mosley and by him conveyed to said

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Wherein James the Contract in Reference to which will be found recorded in the office of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Green County Georgia about the year 1841. Said land to be equally divided between me and three a like between my wife and each of my children now in use or that may hereafter be born to me Subject to the Limitations herein after mentioned.

My will and desire is that all the rest of my Estate both Real and Personal of every description whatever be divided into such a number of equal Shares as may be desired for one Share each to go to and be divided between my wife and my children that now are in being or that may hereafter be born to me Subject to the Limitation and charge herein after mentioned.

When each of the legacies herein bequeathed except that given to my wife in the 1st item of this Will I hereby Expressly Charge an ample and comfortable Support for my aged Father Thomas Mosley during his natural life. Each of said legacies except as in this 3rd item Excepted to Contribute for Rate towards his complete Maintenance and Support annually this charge for his support to be the first money paid.

My intention will and desire is that all the legacies in this Will Given to my wife except that bequeathed to her in the first item herein shall continue and be for her use and enjoyment during her natural life and at her death to go to and be equally divided between my children now living or that may hereafter be born to me. And if it should so happen that all my children now living or hereafter be born to me shall die before the age of twenty one years or marriage then and in that event my desire is that at the death of my wife all the legacies and interest herein mentioned except that given to my wife in the first item and except the provision herein made for the support of my aged father shall go to and be equally divided between my two Brothers Wm R. Mosley and John A. Mosley Heirs and theirs a like this 20th Jan 1858 Benjamin T. Mosley (Seal) Signed Published and declared in presence
