her will & desire was that her husband Mr McLuttre to have his dower out of the ^{land} ^{he} land & to include
the house in his dower that he also have a horse out of her horses also to have a defining of horses
furniture bedding &c or that the house be not stripped too closely by her sisters. It was also his will that
that her sister Mrs E. C. Phillips should have taken & paid one thousand dollars to be paid out of the
proceeds of her estate besides her husbands dower horse &c said thousand dollars to be deposited
in the Rome Bank at Rome Georgia & said Mrs E. C. Phillips to draw out the interest on the same
as she may want it that her will and desire was that Mrs Jane Rogers should have taken
& possess three hundred dollars to be paid out of the proceeds of her estate besides the part
of her husband that her will & desire was that Mrs E. C. Phillips & Mrs Jane Rogers should
equally her wearing apparel & that they should have the household furniture with her
husband and that what remains after her husband receives his dower & horse & said
Mrs E. C. Phillips & Mrs Jane Rogers receive their legacies aforesaid & they
their household furniture as aforesaid is to go to the children of her first husband
Brothers & sisters children that her husband Mr McLuttre to have a living
