Peach County J. S. M. Morgan Sr. of said State and County being of advanced age but of sound
and disposing mind and memory knowing that I must shortly depart this life deem
it right and proper both as respects my family & myself that I should make a
disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me I do therefore
make this my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all others by me
heretofore made

Item 1st I desire & direct that my body be buried in a decent & Christian like manner suitable
to my Circumstances & Constitution in life

Item 2nd I desire & direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors
hereinafter named & appointed

Item 3rd I give bequeath & devise to my wife Sarah Morgan for and during her natural life
or widowhood. five hundred Dollars to be managed directed & controlled by
Woodson, M. Morgan for the use & benefit of my said wife and at her death or
marriage to go to & belong to my son Woodson, M. Morgan if any remains. If the
said Woodson, M. Morgan shall depart this life before my said wife. Then my will
& wish is that my son in law, L. C. Waits shall manage direct & control for my
said wife and in case he shall survive her then he is to have what remains
of the Estate herein given to my said wife at her death

Item 4th It is my will & wish & I do direct that my plantation & a deficiency of the state
to run the same be not sold until after my youngest child Julius, M. Morgan
shall reach the age of legal majority that the said farm shall be run &
managed by my said Executors for the joint benefit of my wife & minor children
until my said youngest son, Julius, M. Morgan shall reach legal majority
my said Executors are expected to keep the farm in good & decent repair & from the
proceeds thereof to pay the expenses of repairing & pay themselves for their trouble
in managing the same. And I desire & direct that my wife & minor children remain
on the plantation at the old homestead where I now reside until my youngest
son Julius, M. Morgan shall reach his legal majority

Item 5th I desire & direct that my Executors give to my son Julius, M. Morgan one years
schooling the expenses of the same to be paid out of my Estate and I also direct
that my said wife Sarah Morgan have one feather bed, bedstead & bedding, Sewing
machine & my horse Charles & Buggy during her natural life & at my wife's death
the sewing machine herein mentioned is to go to my daughter Sedor Morgan
And I also direct & devise that my said daughter Sedor Morgan have the
Organ now owned by her free of charge

Item 6th I desire & direct that after my just debts are all paid off & discharged & my wife
provided for as is under cateded in the 3rd item of this my will, & my son
Julius, M. Morgan shall have reached his legal majority. then in that event
my Executors are to sell at Private Sale to the best advantage the remainder
of my property of any & every description whatsoever. The proceeds to be
equally divided & distributed between all my children Shun & Shon
to wit James, R. Morgan - Lady, C. Bain the wife of Manning Cain, R. M. Morgan
George W. Morgan Jr - Joseph, M. Morgan - William, M. Morgan - Frank, L. Morgan
Mary, A. Waits wife of L. C. Waits Woodson, M. Morgan - Sedor Morgan, Julius
M. Morgan they my said children being required to account for all advances
made by me & to have deducted from their said shares of my estate the
sum or sum that they may be indebted to me at the time of my death
And I also direct that at my death, my Executors as soon as this my will is
proven in solemn form are to sell at Private Sale all my remaining
lands, surplus cash that I owned to my son Jaron as mentioned

in the fourth item of this my will & collect what debts due my estate and apply the proceeds to the payment of my debts & to defray other expenses

Item 7th read for the purpose of carrying out this my will I hereby appoint & constitute Joseph M. Morgan Frank L. Morgan Woodson H. Morgan my son Executors of this my will & testament this 15th day of November 1881
