I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Sarah the sixth part of all my
Property both real and personal whenever and whatever it may be

Thirdly

I give and bequeath and devise to my son John J. Drummond one sixth part of all my
Property except One Hundred and Thirty Dollars which I direct to be deducted from his part

Fourthly

I give and bequeath and devise to my son Joseph V. Drummond one sixth part of all
my property except Forty Dollars which I direct to be deducted from his part

Fifthly

I give and bequeath to my son Daniel P. Drummond one sixth part of all my property
except sixty two Dollars which I direct to be deducted from his part

Sixthly

I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Margaret Drummond one sixth part of
all my property except Fifty five Dollars which I direct to be deducted from her part

Seventhly

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Issabella Medauniel one sixth part of all my
property except Eighty Dollars which I direct to be deducted from her part

Eighthly

I give and bequeath to my son George L. Drummond one sixth part of all my property
except Fifty Dollars which I direct to be deducted from his part

Ninthly

I give and bequeath to my Grand son and Grand Daughter John B. Camp and Rilday Camp
jointly one sixth part of all my property

Tenthly

I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Nancy Stokes one sixth part of all my
Property except Ten Dollars which I direct to be deducted from her part

Eleventhly

I hereby constitute and appoint my son George L. Drummond Executor of this my
Will and Testament this June 25th 1873 Henry Drummond
