Thirdly That the merits and attainment of the blessed God and Lazarus Jesus Christ

I direct and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my executors during my life or after my
I give and bequeath to my son John W. Whitehead one half of my estate and
the children of my deceased daughter E. A. Morris the children of my deceased daughter E. A.
Camp and to Wildard A. Morris child of my deceased daughter Mary W. Whitehead one third of my estate
I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Martha W. Whitehead the entire residue of my property con-
ting of land negroes money notes &c to have and to hold during her life or widowhood notwithstanding
her no disposal of said property to the heirs of her body as she may dispose during her life or widowhood
and at her death or intermarriage the entire property remaining, owned by her through this testator
is to be so divided as to make all the heirs of her body equal in the portions owned by them severally
and my estate

Fifthly I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Martha W. Whitehead my minister of law my attorney
and testament. Signed sealed declared and published by James Whitehead as his last will and
testament in presence of us the undersigned who subscribed our names wrote in presence of said James Whitehead
Special instance and request and in the presence of each other. James Whitehead

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Item 2^d I have all my by these presents Test a will & testament of this County and State aforesaid being
in consideration of sound mind and memory do make this day 1st of July 1866. Testament
I do will all the property both real and personal which I may die possessed of to my husband William
McGraffton during the term of his natural life for the benefit of him my said husband, and for the
maintenance and education of my son Mitchell Hampton and of any other children I may have by my
said husband.

Item 3^e It is my will that at my said husbands death all the property both real and personal which may have
been acquired by my said husband according to the first item of this my last will and testament
together with its natural increase shall descend and belong to my son Mitchell Hampton and any
other child or children I may hereafter have by my aforesaid husband.

Item 3^f It is my will that if my son Mitchell Hampton and any other child or children I may hereafter
have by my said husband should die in infancy or before having any legal heir or heirs, then and
in that case, all the property aforesaid together with its natural increase shall descend and belong
to my son William G. Gibson under the conditions set forth in the following item.

Item 4^g It is my will that should any son William G. Gibson die in infancy, or without having any legal
child or children, then and in that case all the property both real and personal together with its natural
increase as aforesaid, shall descend to, and be divided equally among my following brothers and sisters.
To wit, William T. James, George C. James, Leman C. George and Alatia C. Morrison.

Item 5^h It is my will that my husband William M. Hampton be required out of the artificial income
of the property aforesaid to purchase and give to my son William G. Gibson a gold watch.
In witness whereof I have herein set my hand and seal this the 25th day of July one
