

Georgia In the Name of God Amen

John B. Wood of said County and State being of advanced age, but of sound and disposing mind and memory, and knowing I must shortly depart this life deem it right and proper both as respects my family and myself, that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me I do therefore make this my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made.

First I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. my Soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it. as I hope for rest and salvation through the merits and atonement of our Blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ

Secondly I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay if there be any at my death. by my Executor hereinafter named and appointed

Thirdly I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Nancy A. Wood all my Property of every description, both real and personal, and Choses in action, To have and to hold the same to her own proper use benefit and behoof. for and during her natural life and at her death whatever of my Estate that may be left to be equally divided share and share alike between my son William A. Wood, my Grand Daughter, Nancy A. White, daughter of Burton A. Wood deceased, Caroline, b. Beck and my Sister in Law Mrs Elizabeth H. Calowen provided she the said Elizabeth shall remain with and aid and assist me and my said wife in our old age and infirmities while living but if she shall leave us while living and cease to render us assistance and stay with us for company in our old age then she to have nothing and my son John, M. Wood having heretofore received from my effects the sum of one hundred and fifty Dollars and the treatment of him and his wife towards me and his Mother in our old age have been such that I doubt think he is entitle to any more of my effects it is therefore my will and desire that he receive no more of my Estate except the above named one hundred and fifty Dollars already received

Fourthly I nominate and appoint my friend W. H. Beck Executor of this my last will and testament and especially request of him that he execute the same and wind up my Estate according to this will. this the 3rd day of June 1870
